I hope you and your family had a wonderful Thanksgiving. It's hard to believe 2023 is just around the corner. This memo will attempt to bring you up to speed on a few items pertaining to our community.

Dredging – I am sure most of you know the dredging project is now complete. Over 3,000 cubic yards of silt were removed from the silt basin located just off 142nd street. Barges transported the silt from the basin to the boat ramp and then loaded by backhoes into dump trucks which ultimately unloaded off premises. The previous dredging prior to this was in 2014. This is the longest period the Lake has gone between dredging since the inception and construction of the Lake in late 1988. Hopefully this is a good sign that the siltation is slowing. This expense is undoubtably the largest single expense for the association.

Geese - We will see many returning geese invading our two lakes this Winter. The increase in geese invites yard damage, waste droppings, and noise. We get several complaints annually from CCOA residents, especially those who live on or near the lake. As a result, we have 7-8 individuals each year located around the lakes that have been issued Pyrotechnic Pistols during defined times of day. These pistols are used to fire two types of noise-scare cartridges, Bird Bangers and Screamers. Both the City of Clive and West Des Moines are aware of our procedures. Special Permits to shoot these cartridges are not required. Again, these pistols do not fire bullets, they only produce noise to scare away the geese.

Winter Months and Sledding – Please be careful when driving through the neighborhood over the winter months when the roads get worse. Particularly on Country Club Blvd. near the hill across from the lake, where adults and children often sled.

Construction and Remodeling projects – have slowed considerably due to winter. As you plan for 2023 projects, please note that Board approval is required for all resident roof replacements, erosion controls pads, sheds, solar panels, swimming pools and fencing. The Architectural Review Form can be found on the website under information/rules and procedures. This form must be completed and submitted by residents prior to remodeling.
